

Phantom Pregnancy in Dogs

Phantom or false pregnancies are common in unneutered female dogs. This condition mimics the symptoms of pregnancy, even though the dog is not pregnant or planning to have puppies. Here's what you need to know about phantom pregnancies and how to manage them.

What Causes a Phantom Pregnancy?

After each heat cycle, hormonal changes occur in female dogs to prepare their bodies for pregnancy, whether they are pregnant or not. These hormonal shifts can cause some dogs to exhibit signs of pregnancy. This behaviour may stem from a natural survival strategy where, in wild packs, non-pregnant females could help care for puppies.



How Long Does a Phantom Pregnancy Last?

The duration of a phantom pregnancy depends on the severity of the symptoms. It can last anywhere from **one week to a month**.

Symptoms of a Phantom Pregnancy

Common signs of a phantom pregnancy in dogs include:

- **Lethargy:** The dog may seem unusually tired or inactive.
- **Depression or behavioural changes:** Mood swings, anxiety, or clinginess.
- **Loss of appetite:** Some dogs may eat less or show disinterest in food.

- **Mammary gland secretion:** Milk production may occur, even without pregnancy.
- **Swollen belly:** Some dogs may exhibit physical signs of pregnancy.



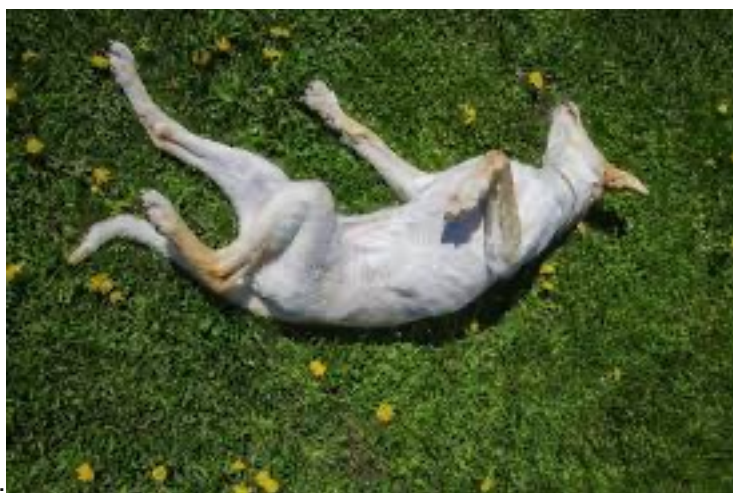
What Should You Do if Your Dog Is Experiencing a Phantom Pregnancy?

If you suspect your dog is having a phantom pregnancy, **visit your vet**. They will check for a real pregnancy or other medical conditions that could be causing similar symptoms.

Treatment for Phantom Pregnancies

In most cases, treatment isn't necessary, and the symptoms will resolve on their own. To help the process:

- Avoid stroking or bathing the mammary glands, as this can stimulate milk production.
- If symptoms persist or become severe, your vet might recommend hormone



therapy or other treatments.

Preventing Phantom Pregnancies

The only sure way to prevent a phantom pregnancy is by **neutering** your dog. Neutering not only eliminates the risk of false pregnancies but also reduces the risk of breast cancer and prevents uterine infections (such as pyometra), which can be life-threatening.
